

The 2025 Dance in the Vineyard Dressage Festival held at the Kelowna Riding Club (KRC) is a sanctioned GOLD and BRONZE competition of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, KlH 7X7, Canada and is governed by the rules of EC. (rule A602.1)

"Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the

current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC

Rule Book." (rule A602.2)

"Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition" (rule A602.7)

It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be

knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition.

### Statement of Principles - Horse Welfare

EC supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its Jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors, and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.

NOTE: Entry deadline: September 3rd, 2025

### Entries

- a) Please use the checklist to ensure all items are included in your email.
- (IMPORTANT: your entry will not be processed until all of these have been received)
- b) Please send e-transfers to payment@kelownaridingclub.ca
- c) Please send confirmation of your e-transfer to Sarah Dunn, dressage@kelownaridingclub.ca
- d) Late entries and changes to your entry after the ride times have been posted will be subject to a charge of \$35.00 no exceptions.

f) Stall Deposits - CASH ONLY - We are accepting cash only for stall deposits at the Show Office. Deposit must be received when you check in on the Friday of the show.

#### RIDE TIMES:

- Scheduled ride times will be available at Fox Village Dressage website by Wednesday, Sept 10, 2025
- \*Hint: Search under BC and B.C., if you don't see the show where you expected it. Fox Village contains the latest schedule information up to the start of the show day.
- Ride times will also be posted on KRC web site. Scheduled ride times will be emailed by Sept 10, 2025, to the email address on the entry form.
- 'Daily Order of go' will supersede all previous schedules.
- Day Sheets will be posted in Club House & Warm Up Ring.
- Scratches must be reported to the show Secretary.

#### SCHEDULED AND OFFICIAL RIDE TIMES:

• While the show will make every effort to adhere to the ride times published on Fox Village Dressage, short notice changes may occur.

#### **SHOW OFFICE:**

• The show office is in the Club House and will be open at 7:00 am on Saturday and Sunday.

#### "ORDER OF GO" SCHEDULE:

- Start time will be confirmed dependent on entries.
- It is anticipated that rides will begin at 8:00 am each day in designated Rings. See signs and stabling map for ring locations.
- There will be a one-hour break approximately around noon each day.
- The warm-up ring will be open at 7:00 am. No warm-up is allowed in the designated show rings on the days of competition.



#### TACK & DRESS:

 Tack & Dress according to 2024 EC Section E Rules. Note: all riders to wear approved helmets when mounted at the event location (Article E 4.0 Safety Headgear). See Equestrian Canada Dressage Rules for the 2024 Rulebook.

#### **DEFINITIONS & ELIGIBILITY:**

- Adults: Individuals are adults, or seniors, from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 19.
- Amateurs: Adults eligible to compete in EC Amateur Classes as per EC Article A902. A person competing in EC amateur classes must hold a valid EC Sport Licence and have a current Amateur status.
- Coach: Equestrian Coaches who have completed an evaluation and are certified by EC in partnership with the Coaching Association of Canada and hold a current coaching status with EC.
- **NEW** "When registering for EC-sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See the Rules of Equestrian Canada Rule Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- FEI Age Limitations: See Article E3.4.4, FEI Age Limitations

#### **JUNIORS**

• Individuals are Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. Juniors are not eligible to compete in the amateur category.

### PERSON RESPONSIBLE (PR)

- The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse, and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules.
- The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations.
- Every entry form for an EC-sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. Refer to the General Regulations glossary definition of the Person Responsible.
- The Person Responsible must hold an EC Sport License (see A801.6).

#### **PONIES**

• A pony is a small horse whose height at the withers, having been measured on a smooth level surface, does not exceed 148 cm without shoes or 149cm with shoes.

#### LICENCE AND MEMBERSHIP:

- 2025 Bronze or Gold EC Sport Licences are required by competitors, owners, or lessees, and individuals accepting responsibility for entries in an EC-sanctioned competition. Bronze Sport License holders competing in the Gold competition may purchase a single event upgrade or a Gold Sport License directly from EC.
- Valid EC Horse Recording, 2025 EC Horse Activation are required for Gold competition.
- Vaccination documentation required.
- 2025 Horse Council BC or Provincial equivalent or USEF required.

"Canadian entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit." (rule A602.4)



#### FREESTYLES:

- All freestyles will follow the Division Classes on Saturday at approximately 4 p.m.
- Please provide your music to the Show Secretary upon registration. If using a phone, please ensure you have someone able to operate it.
- Music/sound checks will be on Friday at 5 pm or during lunch break on Saturday.

#### Freestyle riders in gold and bronze competition. (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels offered)

- Gold Competitors
  - A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle:
    - a minimum score of 60% in a technical dressage test at the same level, or higher.
    - The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. Article E 10.6.
    - Technical scores earned at silver competitions count toward entering freestyle in a Gold competition and vice versa.
- Bronze Competitors
  - Requires no minimum technical score.
  - A rider in the Bronze competition may enter a freestyle without having ridden the technical test.
    - (e.g., competes in first-level technical and second-level freestyle).

#### WDAA WESTERN DRESSAGE

- These classes are considered miscellaneous classes under EC rules and are not eligible for EC awards.
- Western Dressage Riders are required to wear approved protective headgear.
- WDAA Western Dressage tests are available upon request. The Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine classes.

### **EQUITATION**

### **Rising Stars Equitation Division**

- This program has been created to emphasize the importance of equitation and its influence and effect on the performance of the horse. For more information, refer to www.risingstarsdressage.com.
- The Rising Stars Equitation Program is for all Youth Dressage Riders, up to and including 25 years of age.

  Using a one-judge system, a Dressage Equitation Judge will use the \*Rising Stars Youth Dressage Equitation

  Score Sheet to evaluate the rider based solely on rider skills during a technical dressage test.
- A technical test will be used for the equitation evaluation at each level; Test 2 of each level –
- The Youth Dressage Rider will ride their technical test at their level, but will only be judged on their equitation. The Equitation Judge in this case will sit at C.
- This class will determine the Rising Stars Equitation Champion and Reserve awards, unmounted presentation for awards.
- The riders/competitors will be grouped in one of the two categories:
  - A) Foundation level: those competing at \*\*Introductory, Training, First, and Second, or,
  - B) Progressive level: those competing at Third, Fourth, and FEI



#### ROSETTES

• Rosettes to fourth (4th) place will be awarded at the completion of every class.

#### SCORING

Points awarded by the judges are final.

• Where there is only one rider in a class, percentages will be applied as follows:

lst place −63% or higher;
2nd 60% - 62.99%;

∘ 3rd 58 - 59.99%:

No ribbons or prizes below 3rd position

• Class Scores will be posted in the clubhouse when the class is complete and scores are ready for posting.

### Test and Rosettes Acceptance Location

• Tests and rosettes may be picked up at the prize area in the clubhouse on completion of each class/level and posting of results.

### Presentations for Championships and Awards

- Division Championships & Awards will be presented upon completion of each division.
  Riders should be prepared to present themselves in show attire, mounted or unmounted, at the clubhouse area for award presentation and pictures. Pictures may include the horse at the show's discretion.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to alter, cancel or combine any awards.

### Ribbon Return Program

• Those who opt to return their ribbons during the show will receive an entry per ribbon into a gift basket draw to take place on Sunday, 30minutes after the last class ends. Winner must be on-site to receive gift basket or draw will continue until a winner who is present is drawn.

## Gold and Bronze Recognized Division Championships

- A Championship will be presented in both the Bronze and Gold competitions for each Division and Category with 4 or more entries. If less than 4 entries in the Division, the Champion will require a minimum score of 63%, and the Reserve will require a minimum of 60%.
- Championship eligibility: All Rider/Horse combinations except FEI must enter a minimum of 3 tests, two of which are designated "C" classes. FEI rider/horse must enter a minimum of 2 classes.
- The Champion will be determined by the horse/rider combination with the highest combined percentages achieved in the 2 designated "C" classes at each level (E9.10.4)
- The designated classes are Test 2 on Saturday and Test 3 on Sunday at each level.
- These class names and numbers are labelled with a 'C' in the CLASSES OFFERED.
- In the event of a tie for the championship, the competitor with the highest single percentage score on the more difficult test is declared the winner.
- Any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not receive an award as per Art. E 9.10.7.
- Test of choice (TOC) and Freestyle classes do not qualify for championship calculations.

# Awards

## Adult Amateur High Score

High Score AA will be awarded to the highest amateur score in either the Bronze or Gold competitions.

## Golden Years Award - High Score

Will be presented to the adult amateur rider and horse combination with a combined age of 70+ years, who achieves the highest score in either the Bronze or Gold competitions. This award is to celebrate the dedication, passion, and partnership between riders and horses of all levels, who continue to excel and inspire others in the equestrian community.

## Junior - High Score - 18 and under.

High Score Junior will be awarded to the highest Junior score in either the Bronze or Gold competitions.

## Western Dressage High Score

WDAA Western Dressage high-score

## Sports-Womanship Award (Sportsmanship Award)

Is a recognition given to an individual who demonstrates integrity, respect for their equine partners, and good sportsmanship towards fellow competitors.

It acknowledges an individual who upholds the highest standards of ethical behavior and fair play within the sport.

# **General Information**

### Warm Up Ring Basic Code of Conduct

- Riders should pass each other left hand to left hand.
- Slower gaits take the inside track.
- The warm-up arena is for work.
- Control your whip.
- Lunge only in the designated Lungeing Ring

### THE CURRENT EC RULE BOOK WILL BE IN EFFECT

- "Horses entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location" (rule A602.5).
- Riders mounted on a horse must wear an ASTM/SEI or BSI/BS EN approved helmet, with a safety harness correctly fastened.
- Only horses wearing a competition number are allowed on the grounds during competition days.
- Competition numbers must be worn by the horse or rider/handler at all times the horse is on the grounds (except when in stall or trailer).
- Appropriate footwear must be worn when mounted.
- Any contestant demonstrating unsafe or unsportsmanlike behavior will be disqualified for the remainder of the show without refund of entry fees.
- Dogs must be kept on leashes. Please 'pick up'!
- Lunging is only allowed in specified ring from 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. The round pen by the entry gate is open at any time.
- The management reserves the right to limit entries or refuse an entry.
- The management reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and correct any error or omission in the program.
- Protests or objections will be handled by the management.
- Hors Concours entries accepted at full entry fee and subject to all EC rules, including EC sport licences and EC Horse Records, but are not eligible for placings, ribbons, or awards.
- Copies of the EC tests may be found at <a href="https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests">https://www.equestrian.ca/sport/dressage/tests</a>. Please be sure you have the current edition of the tests.
- Note: 2017 amendment to Error Penalization: 1st Error = 2 points, 2nd Error = 4 points, 3rd Error = elimination. However, at the discretion of the judge, the rider may continue to finish to test. See Art E 9.3.2.
- It is the responsibility of the contestants to present themselves, while still mounted, to the Steward immediately following their ride. Failure to do so will incur elimination.
- Failure to ride at your scheduled time will incur elimination.
- Classes may not be run in the same sequence as listed in this prize list.
- It is the competitors' responsibility to check the posted schedule of ride times for any changes. Ride times may be rescheduled due to unforeseen conflicts.
- Whips may be to a maximum length of 1.20m (1.00m for ponies)
- Test callers are permitted as per EC/FEI rules and are required to have appropriate dress.
- The competition will not provide a gatekeeper. If one is desired, it is the responsibility of the rider to arrange for someone to close the gate for the entire class.
- Competition rings are sand footing. All tests are in a 20 x 60 m ring unless specified with entry form.

# Vaccinations

### **VACCINATIONS: EC RULE A519 VACCINATIONS**

All horse entered in any class at a competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations." (rule A602.8) All horses attending Equestrian Canada-sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested."

# Biosecurity

Kelowna Riding Club is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices.

- All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days.
- Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact KRC prior to entry to the show grounds.
- We ask that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) be reported to show management.
- Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area.
- Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/drinking buckets.
- The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak.

We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to everyone having a successful horse show experience.

- Pay for Play (Schooling horses) must complete entry forms with and submit by email prior to the closing date.
- Schooling horses will be assigned an entry number which must be always worn when outside of stall and on the competition grounds.

### **CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS**

- Cancellations received before the closing date will have a full refund less an admin fee of \$25.00.
