

Schooling Rounds

Saturday, April 12 at 9:00 am

Hunter/Jumper Schooling

9:00 am - 10:00 am 3' and over 10:00 am - 11:30 am 2'9" to 3'0" 12:00 pm - 2:00 pm 2'3" to 2'6" 2:00 pm -4:00 pm cross poles to 2'

A combination of hunter and jumper elements will be set within one riding ring. Blocks of time may be booked to allow up to three horses (and a coach) in the ring at one time. Each rider is allowed 10 minutes per horse, so a maximum of 30 minutes per group. Additional horses or time may be requested. All times and heights may be adjusted to accommodate entries. Hacking is available before 9:00 am. Please sign up for times with the Entry Secretary or check at the gate for available time slots.

Hunter/Jumper Clear Rounds

There will be posted courses for both the hunter and jumper rings. Riders are encouraged to ride individual rounds, with one horse/rider combination in the ring at one time. Coaches may also be in the ring. All times and heights may be adjusted to accommodate entries. Hacking is available before 9:00 am. Please sign up for times with the Entry Secretary or check at the gate for available time slots.

GENERAL INFORMATION

LIABILITY

All owners and competitors and trainers are personally responsible for damages to persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. The owners and competitors and trainers MUST have third party insurance to provide full coverage for participation in equestrian events at any of the KRC Hunter Jumper Shows. Neither KRC nor, nor their organizing committee, board of directors, sponsors, employees, volunteers nor contractors shall be in any way liable for any accident, injury, death, damage, loss or any other matter that may happen, from any causes or circumstances whatsoever to competitors, exhibitors, or members of their family or their agents, or to any animal or article exhibited or to any property brought on to KRC property, or for any other loss, claim, matter, circumstance or event whatsoever in connection with or arising out of or attributable to any of the KRC Hunter Jumper Horse Shows.

RV PARKING Parking is available for RVs and campers at a first come first serve basis. There are no hook-ups however there are showers available on the grounds. The cost to camp for the show is \$50.00.

VACCINATIONS All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations.

exhibitors and their horses. All horses are required to have a BioSecurity Form (located online and at back of Prize Book) submitted to the show office prior to receiving their competition number. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days. Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact KRC prior to entry to the show grounds. We ask that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) be reported to show management. Any horse identified to have or is suspected of a having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/drinking buckets. The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak. We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to everyone having a successful horse show experience.

STABLING and CLEAN OUT

Stalls will be available at the rate of \$30.00 per stall per night plus unlimited shavings for KRC members. The rate for non-members is \$45 per stall per night. There will be an additional \$50.00 charge per horse stall for clean out. Once the stall has been broom-swept clean upon departure (including all hay, garbage, etc.) and the horse show office has been notified, the \$50.00 will be refunded. Stabling will be available beginning Friday morning after 8AM, ending Sunday.

MANURE

Manure must be placed in the designated area. Trash must be kept separate from manure and placed in appropriate receptacles.

ATTIRE

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR

Anyone mounted on a horse must wear approved equestrian head gear, with safety harness correctly fastened, at all times.

DRESS

Formal show attire not required but approved safety helmets and proper boots are mandatory when mounted.

CONCUSSION

Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitors must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel on-site before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the on-site medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If on-site qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

FALLS

All competitors that have had a fall during training/warm up on the Competition site or in the Competition Arena/Field of Play must be assessed by qualified medical personnel onsite before they either take part in another test or competition. Competitors must not re-mount their horse until this assessment has been completed. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place by the onsite qualified medical personnel. Section A General Rules 101.2

ABUSE

Abuse of the horse is strictly forbidden. Abuse includes, but is not restricted to, excessive use of spurs, abuse of the whip and brutal use of the reins during halts or rein backs, repeated tugs on the horse's mouth. EC Section A, General Rules 517.

EARPHONES AND EARBUDS

Earphones/Earbuds and/or other electronic communication devices are strictly prohibited in the arena. The use of only one earphone/earbud is allowed while mounted everywhere within the grounds of the Event except the arena. When mounted, only handsfree communication is permitted at KRC. Article G114.4

HORSE SHOW OFFICE HOURS

The horse show office will be open from 8:00am to 5:00pm on Saturday and Sunday.

PARKING

- There will be no parking whatsoever by the barn areas. A lot will be designated for car/truck and trailer parking.
- Will be under the direction of Show Management; please co-operate with the volunteers who co-ordinate parking.

FOOTING

All arenas are sand footing.

SMOKING

Please observe all posted signs and no smoking at least 10 meters for all barns.

DOGS

All dogs must be on a controlled leash on the show grounds. Absolutely no dogs in the schooling or show arenas at any time. If dogs are being loud or unruly, management reserves the right to ask them to be removed.

LONGEING

Longeing is permitted in the longeing sand ring each day. A round pen will be available if your horse may provide a distraction for horses within the jumper ring.

HACKING Hacking is permitted in the rings until 9:00 am
